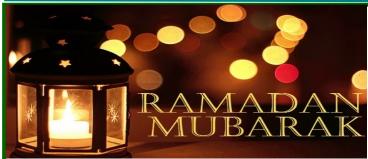

MCWS 7th Annual Seerah Competition Written by Haneen Hasan & Maaria Anwar

April 21st marked MCWS's 7th annual Seerah Competition. Yes, it really has been 7 years since the first time kids from all over Michigan raced to learn the most they could about the life of the Prophet Muhammad (saw). Topics have ranged from actual seerah, to the lives of other prophets, and to the stories of the Sahaba. Last year however, competitors once again picked up their Seerah books for the Makkan period, and this time continued with the first part of Madani Seerah.

For the 7th year in a row, Seerah Competition offered free coaching sessions to competitors every Saturday. This year's coaching sessions saw over 400 participants, a breaking record for Seerah coaching. Sessions are taught by trained coaches armed with exciting hands on activities and worksheets. Although classes are held at MCWS, dozens of kids from the IAGD and ICD communities were able to make it by bus.

The almost 600 Seerah Competition participants were, in addition to Madani Seerah required to learn about the daily routine of the Prophet Muhammad (saw). They learned about how he (saw) scheduled his day around salah, how he woke up, how much time he allotted to the various duties in his life, and overall how balanced he (saw) was. Participants were encouraged to implement all of these qualities into their own routines.

This year also marked Seerah Challenge's 2nd year. The Seerah Challenge is for adults to participate along with their kids. This year there were about 70 people who listened to Seerah lectures of their choice and recorded their favorite parts to win a special prize. Seerah Challenge allows adults, no matter how busy, to keep up with the kids in the community who are learning about their Prophet (saw).

A day of absolute light, life, and enjoyment was made possible by the more than 70 volunteers who worked tirelessly to make Seerah Competition happen. From the theme, to coaching sessions, to decoration, to the amazing prizes that keep kids coming back year after year, all of this was due to the mercy of Allah (swt) and the dedicated volunteers. If the biryani and other various food items isn't enough to come next year, the looks of enjoyment on kids faces and even the stressed ones coming out of their competition rooms is reason enough.

Although emcee Br. Harun consistently reminded participants, Seerah Competition organizers want to reiterate that every participant is a winner. Truly every child who picked up their books to learn about the perseverance and softness of the Prophet (saw), or better yet applied these qualities to their lives is a winner. Every child whose parents and even grandparents who learned the Seerah by helping them out is a winner. So as Br Harun instructed the audience on the day of the competition: raise your hand up, turn it backwards, and give yourself a pat on the back for job more than well done.

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MCWS RAMADAN PARKING ARRANGEMENTS Updated: April 30th 2018

Please read carefully: GENERAL PARKING RULES:

- 1. Carpool if possible
- 2. ENTRANCE from LOTZ ONLY (either front or back of the building) before 8 rakats
- 3. EXIT from PALMER only before 8 rakats
- 4. After 8 rakats, you can exit from all entrances
- 5. Drop off available on both front and back side of the MASJID
- 6. Parking in front of the MASJID is designated for people with disability ONLY or Shuttles.
- 7. Shuttle Service will be provided ONLY on the first, 27th night of Ramadan (Community Qiyam) and on 29th (Katm-e-Quran night)
- 8. No Shuttles service on any other days
- 9. Overflow Parking Arrangements at <u>TWO</u> designated locations: (Deer Creek/Emerald Pines on Lotz and Iman Drive on Palmer)
- 10. Parking inside Deer Creek Subdivision is LIMITED TO DRIVEWAYS of houses with green/orange flags and on the RIGHT LANE ONLY. No EXCEPTION. Violators will be towed by the Association at owner's expense
- 11. Please be careful when WALKING towards MCWS from Iman Drive as it's a potential safety issue. Shuttles will be not be available at all times
- 12. No Valet Parking Available
- 13. DO NOT PARK inside the LINKS Subdivision located across Masjid on Palmer Road or your vehicle will be towed
- 14. Please respect the volunteers and the subdivision rules and follow the directions and come early.
- 15. Police might be patrolling at nights so please park legally. DOUBLE PARKING is not allowed at any times. Violators will be given a 15 min wait time before being towed and/or a NON-PEELABLE ORANGE WARNING STICKER will be posted on the driver side window.
- 16. All Illegal Parkings will be towed at owner's expense by MCWS appointed towing company

OVERFLOW PARKING AREA

- 1. Drop your passengers at MCWS first, then drive your vehicle to one of the overflow parking location and get a shuttle ride back if available or use sidewalks.
- 2. First Overflow Area: First Entrance of Deer Creek Sub-Division (Off of Lotz, behind MCWS). Please follow the rules for Deer Creek (listed separately below)
- 3. Second Overflow Area: Iman Drive Sub-Division (Off of Palmer, one block east of Lotz). Park on both sides and on the driveways
- 4. Third Overflow Area: Second Entrance of Deer Creek Sub-Division (Emerald Pines Drive). Please follow the rules for Deer Creek (listed separately below)
- 5. Shuttles will be available 15 mins before and after Isha Prayers at the overflow parking area (tentative subject to change)
- 6. All Shuttles will have a sign posted on their windshield

7. Shuttle service will resume after 8 Rakats to take the drivers back to their vehicles. All those who like to stay for 20 rakats MUST bring their vehicles back and park inside MCWS parking area or make their own arrangement

8. For Shuttle related Inquiries, please contact MCWS Parking Coordinator

DEER CREEK SUBDIVISION PARKING RULES - NO EXCEPTIONS:

- 1. Parking inside Deer Creek is a privilege, not a right. Parking is ONLY allowed during designated approved circumstances
- Street parking is allowed on the RIGHT LANE ONLY. DO NOT PARK ON THE LEFT LANE which is a FIRE LANE
- 3. While parking on the streets, must ensure the bumpers do not protrude into the driveway
- Parking allowed on driveways of houses with green/orange flags on Deer Creek and Emerald Pines
- 5. Do not block sidewalks when parking on driveways.
- 6. Do not block mailboxes if you are parking during the daytime
- 7. Please cooperate with residents assisting in parking on their driveway.
- 8. Please use sidewalks instead of passing through their backyard to cross over to the Masjid
- 9. Be careful not to drive on the grass or damage their sprinklers
- 10. Do not honk, talk loudly or use radios or stereo with high volume
- 11. Use common courtesy
- 12. Violators subject to towing by the Deer Creek Home Owners Association.
- 13. Designated MCWS Volunteers will be standing inside Deer Creek to ensure rules are properly enforced

FOR RAMADAN ONLY

14. Parking on the flagged driveways inside Deer Creek and Iman Drive Sub Division is ONLY allowed for approx 30 - 45min after Taraweeh starts

15. Drivers should move their vehicles as soon as the 8 rakats are done (for convenience of others and the home owners) and park on the side lanes or park inside the MCWS Parking Lot.

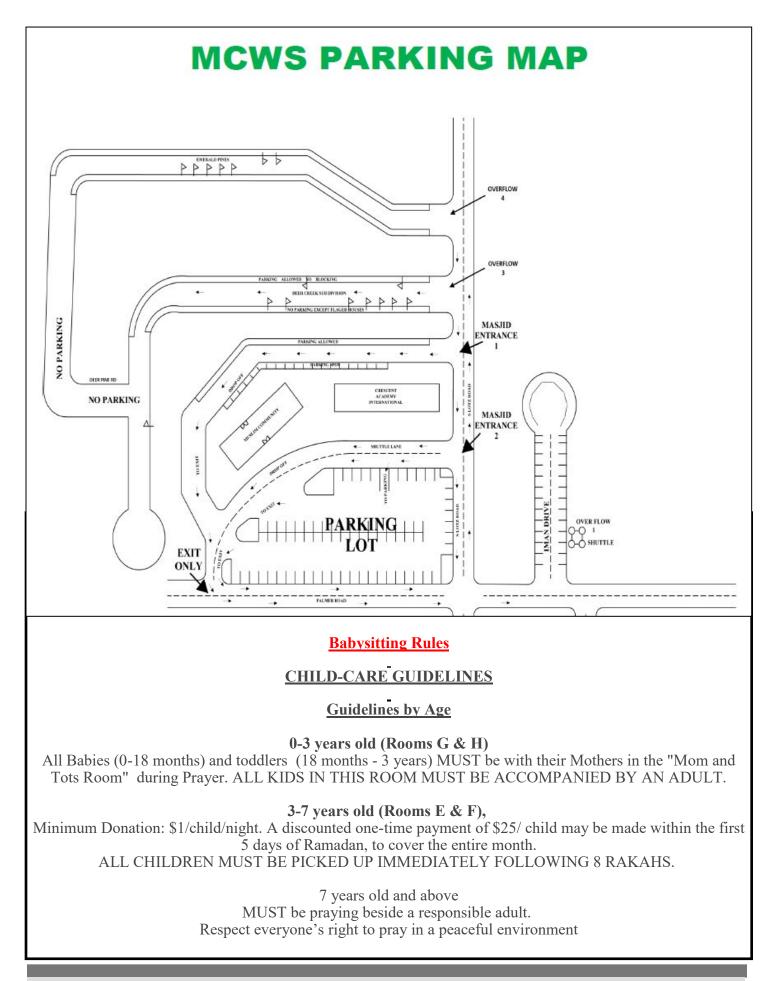

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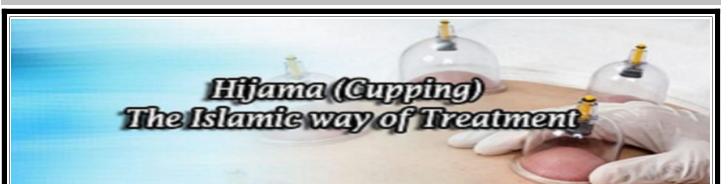
